Course Syllabus

This course – including the bibliography and class discussions – will be conducted entirely in English. The course draws on theories of international institutions to explain comparatively key aspects of the role of international organizations in international politics. The first part of the course introduces the main theoretical approaches that provide alternative explanations for key questions about international organizations: their creation, institutional design, decision-making processes, their impact and their interactions with other international institutions. These questions include why states create international organizations, why states transfer certain powers to them, and what impact they have on the practice of international cooperation with regard to matters of concern to international society such as the maintenance of international peace and security, the management of international economic relations, the promotion of international environmental standards, or the protection of human rights. The second part of the course analyzes these key questions with regard to specific international organizations, including the United Nations, the International Monetary Fund, the World Bank, the World Trade Organization, NATO, regional organizations like the European Union, as well as international organizations in the areas of human rights, environmental protection, and health policy.
